FELLOWSHIP DETAILS

The Advanced Practice Clinician (APC) Palliative Care Fellowship prepares nurse practitioner/physician assistant graduates to become highly skilled and competent providers in Hospice and Palliative Care.

This one-year fellowship is an interprofessional postgraduate program. APC fellows will train with physician co-fellows participating in educational and research opportunities. Clinical rotations include but are not limited to inpatient and outpatient consultative services, home hospice services, integrative medicine, and pain service. The APC will have clinical opportunities to practice in rural communities in Utah, as well as rotate through behavioral mental health services.

STIPEND

Competitive stipend + benefit package. Paid vacation & CME time, travel funds and educational publication resources are included.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Prerequisites:

To be eligible to apply for the APC Palliative Care Fellowship, you must meet the following requirements upon acceptance into the program:

- Graduated from an accredited nurse practitioner program or physician assistant program, with a minimum of a master's degree
- Hold a current license as master's or doctorate-prepared nurse practitioner/physician assistant in the state of Utah or be eligible to apply for UT licensure at the time of offer acceptance, if applicable
- Basic Life Support (BLS) certification*
- Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) registration*
- Previous experience in the nurse practitioner/physician assistant role preferred, but not required

*You do not need proof of DEA licensure or BLS certification at the time of application but must provide documentation of completion prior to fellowship start date.
